Sir,

Herewith I have the honor
to enclose you a List of Orphans and
Children in the Institution and their Ages,
I beg leave to state I am not acquainted
at what age His Excellency may think
proper to order their being apprenticed
out, but I have included all the
Girls in the List from Eleven to Sixteen,
and these are the Girls who do the
work in their turns of Washing, and
Cleaning various parts of the House,
under the House maid, making the
Clothes for this, & Shirts for the M^o School,
The Monitresses you will perceive it
will be almost impossible to do without,
from the number of Small Children
in the Institution and others coming,
who are quite unable to do anything
for themselves, the Girl "Ann Geary"
is a young woman who was sent by
the Archdeacon till she could get a place.

the Master of the Semitropes -

Par. 3. of the Printed Laws enclosed
order, that Boys be apprenticed at Ten
Years and Girls at Twelve. Mr
Lamer has referred to the Register of
Indentures, and it appears that the
age of Twelve in Cases of Girls has been
adhered to

adhered to, with a few ^{they}
exception in which ^{they} have
been apprentices at the earlier
age of Ten and Eleven years.
