

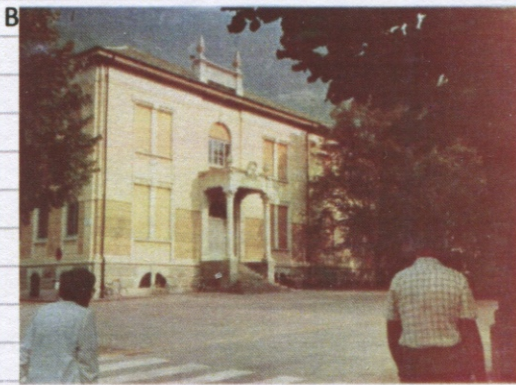

Roma

- 1 Giacomo 1st, Nino's grandfather came out to Australia to work on the Mundaring Weir in the 1880s.
He returned to Tirano
- 2 Domenico Molinari (Barney's father) also went out to Australia when Barney was 6 months old. He returned to Tirano when Barney was 12 years old ie around 1899. He went out to Australia again.
Barney told Roma that he was always very angry with his father for the desertion.
Rumour had it that Domenico had a girl friend out here.
- 3 Giacomo Antonio Pianta went out to Australia in 1905/6 with
- 4 Domenic (Barney's brother)
Giacomo2 and Domenic acquired a hotel & wine saloon with accommodation on the corner of Queen and Wellington Sts.

Giacomo (3) Pietro, Nino, was around 5 when his father left. He told me that his father said before he left. "Look after your mother. Be good and I'll send for you soon."
He waited 7 or 8 years, being good and looking after his mother.



This is his school. He told me that he was quite good at his lessons.

His Uncle Barney "looked after him a bit"
Though an Uncle, Barney was only 13 or or 14 years older.

He made little Giacomo toys out of wood.
Giacomo also saw a lot of his Aunt Nina who was even closer in age and his cousin Lena.

He used to go into Switzerland to buy lollies.

- 5 In 1908, at 20 years, Barney went out to Australia. The only person to meet him was a person from his mother's home town of Teglio.
He went to New Norcia where he worked for 8 years, learning new trades.
I think he had been a bootmaker but he did carpentry at New Norcia and made barrels and church furniture.



This must be a long time later.

He had saved money and he came to Perth and bought Giacomo Antony and Domenic out of the hotel. Domenic and Giacomo had a split.
Rumour has it that Domenic's wife didn't get on with Giacomo' wife.
Domenic married an Australian girl. They went to the Northern goldfields and raised their four children: Mary (1912), Bernado (young Barney) 1914. Arthur (1916) and Jim 1918. Jim died quite young.

With the money from the hotel Giacomo (2) Antony bought property for a dairy farm on the East side of Harbourne St, and set up a dairy farm.

Giacomo never sent for his wife and child. Uncle Barney sent for his sister and helped her to come out

Giacomo had an accident with a horse and cart , suffering head injuries. He never recovered and was looked after at the Little Sisters of the Poor home in Glendalough.

Domenica and Nino came out to Perth around 1914, when Nino was 13.

Nino was very excited to see his Barney again. He told me that he expected his father to meet the boat and say what a good job he had done look-

Nino lived at "The Old Dairy" from around 14 to his early 20s, helping with the dairy and doing a milk round of his own and training and riding trotters.

At Glendalough there was a Reformatory, under the Catholic Church. It had a school attached which took outside pupils. Nino recorded some memories of the school from around 1916 Father Hayes was in charge. There was a big chap, Brother Lalor in charge of flower and vegetable beds. Brother Burke, a tiny chap was a tailor. Boys did half a day school and half a day in the garden. Early on they had a dairy and the boys worked in that. It supplied The Home of the Good Shepherd, St Josephs and St John of God's Hospital

At some stage Giacomo Antony's (Nino's father) brother, Luigi - Uncle Lui, must have come out to Australia also and married an Australian girl, Cecily Franklin, (Auntie Cis). She was musical and a distant relative of Captain .Cook. She taught singing at the Glendalough school. They lived near the water tank in Ewen St. They had no children

Nino said his Uncle Lui Molinari was very kind to him. He married



I am not clear on this but think that the Piantas, (Domenica, Giacomo and Nino) lived together at Glendalough and ran the dairy with Nino at some stage acquiring a milk run. Then at some point in the next 10 years, Giacomo Antonio had an accident in the horse and cart and had serious head injuries.

I think that he went into care at what had been the Reformatory and was now a place for invalids. A relative called Tavi, helped Domenica and Nino with the dairy. Nino took up trotting and may have

Barney told Noel that around this time Nino, Young Barney and Arthur used to get around together and were prone to "steal" his car and get into other mischief.
